Why Study Korean?

Korea has a long history and rich cultural traditions which make it a fascinating place to study. Korea has also played a vital role in East Asian history in interaction with China and Japan, such that a better understanding of Korea is necessary to a complete understanding of East Asia. Today, South Korea is among the top 10 trading partners of the U.S., and North Korea is considered to be among the top national security concerns for the U.S. As a result, the study of Korean language and culture has become increasingly important for American students.

Why Study Korean at UW-Madison?

The UW-Madison is one of the few schools in the nation that offers Korean language study. Although a major in Korean is not yet available, the department provides instruction in the first two years of Korean language and also offers topics courses that focus on Korean culture.

Study Abroad

Students may receive resident credit for study abroad at a program sponsored by the department at Ewha Woman's University in Seoul. Students may also receive transfer credit for study abroad at programs offered by other Korean universities.
